



Drought Tolerant Planting

Tips:

- Make sure the plant is in a suitable area for its needs. (Shade loving in shade, sun loving in sun.)
- The sun and wind can delete plant moisture. Drought tolerant plants can protect less hardy plants from the elements.
- Use mulch around the base of the plant, this will provide nutrients, protect roots, and help retain valuable moisture.
- Check the soil, if it is wet, don't water yet.
- Once plants are established (root system has grown out into surrounding soil) water times and amounts can be decreased.
- Group drought tolerant plants together to keep watering consistent.
- Grasses are drought tolerant.
